Rationale and key rating drivers

CARE Ratings Ltd. had, vide its press release dated April 19, 2023, placed the rating(s) of Swastik Housing & Construction (SHC) under the 'issuer non-cooperating' category as SHC had failed to provide information for monitoring of the rating and had not paid the surveillance fees for the rating exercise as agreed to in its Rating Agreement. SHC continues to be non-cooperative despite repeated requests for submission of information through e-mails, phone calls and a letter/email dated March 04, 2024, March 14, 2024, March 24, 2024.

In line with the extant SEBI guidelines, CARE Ratings Ltd. has reviewed the rating on the basis of the best available information which however, in CARE Ratings Ltd.'s opinion is not sufficient to arrive at a fair rating.

SHC secures its major portion of tenders through open bidding from Indian Oil Corporation Limited (IOCL) and Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited (HPCL). The firm also gets work contract from other government entities and private parties too. The firm is registered as approved contractor with PWD department, Government of Madhya Pradesh. The firm has successfully completed various construction projects majorly in Madhya Pradesh.
