Rationale and key rating drivers

CARE Ratings Ltd. had, vide its press release dated June 20, 2023, placed the rating(s) of Neeraj Paper Marketing Limited (NPML) under the 'issuer non-cooperating' category as NPML had failed to provide information for monitoring of the rating as agreed to in its Rating Agreement. NPML continues to be non-cooperative despite repeated requests for submission of information through e-mails, phone calls and a letter/email dated May 05, 2024, May 15, 2024 and May 25, 2024.

In line with the extant SEBI guidelines, CARE Ratings Ltd. has reviewed the rating on the basis of the best available information which however, in CARE Ratings Ltd.'s opinion is not sufficient to arrive at a fair rating.

The company is engaged in the trading and distribution of writing & printing paper, wastepaper, Kraft Paper, Duplex Board, Poster Paper, and other products. NPML is associated with "Bindal group", Bindals Papers Mills Limited, Bindlas Duplex Limited and Agarwal Duplex Board Limited. NPML procures writing and printing papers from Bindal group and other manufacturers of papers in the market. For trading of wastepaper, NPML procures waste papers from waste paper traders and further sell the same to Bindal group and other manufacturers of papers.
