Rationale and key rating drivers

CARE Ratings Ltd. had, vide its press release dated October 13, 2023, placed the rating(s) of Sri Durga Automotives (SDA) under the 'issuer non-cooperating' category as SDA had failed to provide information for monitoring of the rating as agreed to in its Rating Agreement. SDA continues to be non-cooperative despite repeated requests for submission of information through e-mails dated August 28, 2024, September 07, 2024, September 17, 2024 among others.

In line with the extant SEBI guidelines, CARE Ratings Ltd. has reviewed the rating on the basis of the best available information which however, in CARE Ratings Ltd.'s opinion is not sufficient to arrive at a fair rating.

About the Firm

Andhra Pradesh based, Sri Durga Automotives (SDA) was incorporated in the year 1999 as a Sole proprietorship firm by Mr. S. Mallikarjuna Rao. Further in 2007 SDA was reconstituted as partnership firm with two partners Mr. S. Mallikarjuna Rao (Managing partner) and Mr. S. Durga Prasad Rao- (Executive Partner). The firm is an authorized dealer of Mahindra and 3 CARE Ratings Limited Rationale-Press Release Mahindra Ltd. The Firm is engaged in sale of tractors, two-wheelers and construction equipment and spare parts as well as servicing of vehicles.

Status of non-cooperation with previous CRA: CRISIL has continued the ratings assigned to the bank facilities of SDA to the 'issuer not-cooperating' category vide press release dated June 07, 2024 on account of its inability to carryout review in the absence of requisite information from the firm.
